Launch of the PACT project Website

The PACT project aims to successfully transfer existing knowledge funded by the EC for project developers to the Caucasus Region (Azerbaijan, Armenia, Georgia) and contribute to capacity building and international relations in Caucasus universities.

Research and development in public and private universities remained static in the Caucasus Region in the last years. The majority of doctoral students in Azerbaijan (AZ), Armenia (AM) and Georgia (GE) self-finance their studies. PACT wants to give young researchers in Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia tools to learn how to develop their own project ideas, structure them in order to develop projects.

The European Commission has put enormous effort into developing tools to support project developers and applicants in the process of developing and managing projects with an international or European scope. These tools would offer the possibility of increasing research capacity and international relations in the Caucasus region, but they have never been transferred to the Caucasus Region. The main aim of PACT is to contribute to capacity building in Caucasus universities in project development skills, contributing to developing and strengthening of international relations between EU and Caucasus universities."

The PACT project website http://www.tempuspact.eu/ has been just launched, containing useful information on the project consortium and the project progression. The website offers the possibility of subscribing to the project newsletter and receiving regular updates on the project activities and results. The PACT web is presently only available in English, but versions in Georgian, Armenian and Azerbaijani languages will soon be delivered. The web will shortly give public access to the project Moodle platform, where all the project open on-line resources will be accessible.
